Recent Successes

Since 2006, SSC activists have won **more than 70 victories on campuses across the country**. In only one year, SSC students secured commitments to carbon neutrality, enacted green building policies, improved energy efficiency, secured biodiesel-fueled campus fleets and closed campus roads to cars.

- In 2007, students at the **University of Oklahoma** convinced their president to sign the American College and University Presidents Climate Commitment, pledging to become carbon neutral as soon as possible. In the same year, OU students secured improved bike lanes on campus.

- During 2006-2007, **Portland Community College** students worked with the administration to double the frequency of intercampus shuttles that serve the four campuses and 90,000 commuter students at PCC and fuel them with 20% Biodiesel.

- At **Louisiana State University**, students convinced administrators to close off the nine major roads into the campus and establish new bus routes to increase transportation efficiency. They also created a "Gold Bike Program" giving students access to bikes on campus.
